Ogden City Declares Moderate Water Shortage

Ogden City Water has issued a declaration of moderate water shortage effective through October 15 or until further notice.

The winter of 2020-2021 produced less snowpack than usual, and as a result, Ogden's primary water source, Pineview Reservoir, is 50% of capacity as of June 15th. And is decreasing daily with rising temperatures. Warmer weather and low precipitation in the spring have also resulted in water releases from the reservoir to outpace inflow. Governor Cox issued an Executive Order declaring a State of Emergency due to drought conditions on March 17, 2021. Applicable provisions of Ogden's Water Shortage Management Plan are in force, and all residents are asked to take the following steps to conserve water for the remainder of the summer:



- **Outdoor watering is prohibited between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.** This violation is enforceable by fines beginning at \$50 for the first violation and ranging up with subsequent violations.
- **All residential water customers of Ogden City are encouraged to reduce their water use by at least five percent.** Commercial water customers are encouraged to reduce their water use by at least fifteen percent.
- **Maintain and properly adjust your irrigation system to avoid wasting water.** Adjust watering times based on weather. Grass needs less water than you think.
- **Avoid hard-surface washing of sidewalks and driveways** (Except for health or safety)
- **Use a positive pressure nozzle when washing vehicles.**

Fall CERT Training Registration Open

A Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) basic training course begins September 16 and will be held each Thursday through October 7.

These classes are from 6:00-9:00 p.m. at Weber County Branch Library in Huntsville (131 South 7400 East). The course fee of \$35 pays for personal CERT safety gear including a hard safety helmet, reflective safety vest, leather work gloves, safety glasses, respiratory protection mask, and training materials. Register on the Weber County CERT website for this training course that consists of two sections:

1. Start and complete the self-paced online information portion at:

<https://cert.hazready.com/hazready/home>. Click on Courses and scroll down to find *Online training for CERT 2020.1.3*. Online course time is approximately 8-12 hours and is required before attending the in-class hands-on training in September and October. Print the certificate and bring it to the hands-on in-class portion of the training on September 19.

2. Attend the in-class hands-on skill development and practice section on Thursdays starting September 16 for four weeks. Once the in-class skills portion is completed, an official certificate of CERT course completion will be issued. A late fall October/November CERT course is also being planned here in the Ogden area for those unable to make it to the Huntsville training. Details will be announced soon.

Grilling Safety Tips for Summer

Grilling season is here, and the Ogden City Fire Department would like to remind the community to be safe this summer. Here are three habits that can help prevent accidental fires during summer barbecues:

- **Only use a grill outside.** Have a "safe zone" of 3-feet around the grill at all times that keeps it away from house siding, deck rails, children, and pets.
- **Make sure to open a gas grill before lighting it and watch the flames.** Never leave any grills, fire pits, or patio torches unattended.
- **Clean grills after each use to remove grease.** Place all grill coals in a metal trash can with a lid after they've cooled down.
