You may have seen the army of volunteers recently around town performing various service projects in neighborhoods and beautifying parks. They are part of a new initiative in Ogden called My Hometown Ogden.

My Hometown Initiative is an effort of cooperation from Ogden City and Ogden interdenominational organizations. It exists to help residents of all faith groups to lift and serve one another, improve property conditions and values, and provide a community resource center that will elevate education, provide resources for better job opportunities, and increase neighborly kindness and fellowship. It provides a platform for all residents to serve each other and have the Courage to Care for their neighbors. By doing so, My Hometown will elevate civility, community participation, safety and health protocols, and foster love for each other. In just two completed days of service, more than 1800 volunteers have given 5,600 hours of service, helping 150 homes and various parks! Two community resource centers are expected to open in mid-September and will offer various educational and technical services free to the community.

The next day of service engagement will be on August 13th from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm and again on September 10th and October 15th.

Ogden City is accepting nominations for the annual Mayor's Awards in the Arts until August 26. The number of awards given is dependent

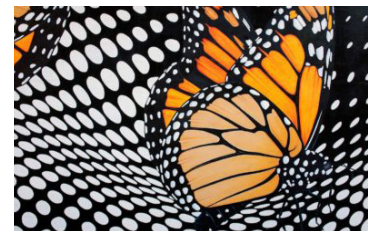
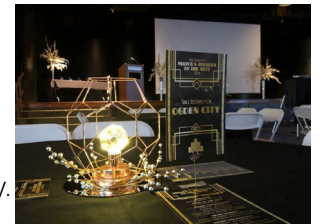

Supporting Local Businesses During Construction

It just got a lot easier to visit several Ogden businesses after UTA reopened a significant section of 25th Street following construction for the Ogden Express (OGX) project. Traffic can make its way

through 25th Street between Washington Boulevard and Adams Avenue. As concrete becomes available, crews will start working on sidewalks, so watch for pedestrian detours. UTA plans to pave and reopen 25th Street from Adams Avenue to Jefferson Avenue in late July or early August. Local businesses remain open during the construction, including The Monarch, WB's Eatery, Art Box, Ogden Contemporary Arts (OCA), The Lotus Café, Yoga Studio & Shop, Cuppa, and Thai Curry Kitchen. Patrons can now park on the street through the area, perfect for lunch or dinner at any of the restaurants and cafes that dot the Nine Rails Creative District. Ogden City is completing its roadway improvements on Ogden Avenue along with waterline replacements on 26th Street. The First Friday Art Stroll is set for August 5th, a great chance to check out the vibrant local art, businesses, and OGX progress. Supporting our local businesses is important as Ogden improves its roadways and transit options.

Emergency Preparedness: Grill Safety

Grilling season is here, and the Ogden City Fire Department would like to remind the community to be safe this summer. Here are some tips and habits that can help prevent accidental fires during summer barbecues:

- **Make sure to open a gas grill before lighting it and watch the flames.** Never leave any grills, fire pits or patio torches unattended.
- **Clean grills after each use to remove grease.** Place all grill coals in a metal trash can with a lid after they've cooled down.
- **Move the grill away from siding, decking, and other things that can catch fire.**
- **Make sure your grill lid is open before lighting it.**
- **Use long-handled barbecue tools when cooking on the grill.**
- **Keep your grill clean and keep children and pets away from the grill area.**
- **Turn off or put out fires before you leave the backyard.**
