FlashVote is an innovative and user-friendly online platform that allows residents like you to participate in quick and meaningful surveys on various city-related topics. It's a simple and efficient way to share your opinions, ideas, and preferences with city officials and decision-makers.

To participate, residents can sign up by scanning the QR code, visiting <https://www.flashvote.com/ogdenut>, or calling 775-235-2240 for phone or text-based involvement. Creating an account is easy, and your personal information is kept secure and private.

Once registered, you'll receive survey invitations via email or text every few months. Surveys are short and can be completed in just a few minutes, giving you a voice in crucial matters affecting our city.

FlashVote covers many topics, from city services and infrastructure to community events and initiatives. Your feedback on issues like budget priorities, parks and recreation enhancements, public safety, and more helps city leaders make informed choices that reflect the needs and desires of the community.

Disposing of Fall Leaves

When leaves start to fall, be sure to dispose of them properly. Be aware while raking leaves this fall that it is a violation of illegal dumping and waterway blocking ordinances to sweep or push leaves into the gutter or onto the street. Fallen leaves can plug storm drains and will cause ice dams to form in the gutters when the weather freezes. Keep the gutter in front of your home clean. Dispose of green waste from seasonal yard cleanup such as branches, leaves, and grass clippings at Ogden City's Green Waste Facility (1845 Monroe Blvd). Residents who are unable to take their leaves to the Green Waste Facility may consider asking relatives, neighbors, or friends to assist them.

National Preparedness Month

September is National Preparedness Month (NPM). It is a time to prepare yourself and those in your care for emergencies and disasters. Police, fire, and rescue may only sometimes be able to reach you quickly in an emergency or disaster. The most important step you can take in helping your local responders is being prepared in order to help take care of yourself and those you are responsible for. The more we are all able to be prepared, the quicker the community will recover.

This September, please prepare and plan for any event where you could be without electricity, water service, access to a supermarket, or local services for several days. Just follow these four steps:

- **Make a Plan:** Discuss, agree on, and document an emergency plan with those in your care. For sample plans, go to Ready.gov. Work together with neighbors, colleagues, and others to build community resilience.
- **Build a Kit:** Keep enough emergency supplies - water, nonperishable food, first aid, prescriptions, a flashlight, and a battery-powered radio.
- **Stay Informed:** Information is available from federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial resources. BeReadyUtah.gov to learn what to do before, during, and after an emergency.
- **Get Involved:** There are many ways to get involved, especially before a disaster occurs. The whole community can participate in programs and activities to make their families, homes and places of worship safer from risks and threats. Community leaders agree that ensuring a safer homeland includes volunteers, a trained and informed public, and increased support of emergency response agencies during disasters.

By taking a few simple actions, you can make your family safer. Take time this month to prepare.
